Spring Hill is a Council/City administrator form of government. The mayor is elected for a four-year term. This elected official presides at City Council meetings, but does not vote except to break a tie. The Mayor appoints City officials, with the consent of the Council, and has the veto power over legislation. Mayoral vetoes may be overridden by a vote of the Council provided at least four of the five Council members support the override. Council members are elected at large for a four-year term.

The Mayor and the City Council combine to form the City's governing body. They are responsible for setting the City's policies and guiding the City's spending. The City's staff oversees the daily operations.

The Governing Body meets at 7 p.m. every second and fourth Thursday of the month. The public is welcome to attend. Council Chambers are located in Room 15 of the Spring Hill Civic Center, 401 North Madison. Meetings are broadcast on a tape-delayed basis on cable channel 6.

Items for Council agendas must be submitted to the City Clerk prior to noon the Thursday preceding the meeting. Agendas are available at City Hall the Monday preceding each meeting.

The Spring Hill School District provides quality educational opportunities for students in Spring Hill, Olathe, Overland Park, and unincorporated areas of Johnson and Miami County. The district encompasses 71 square miles and is approximately 10 minutes south of Olathe, Kansas. The district office is located at 101 E. South Street in Spring Hill, Kansas 66083.

The district's has about 1,700 students who attend classes in four schools: two elementary, one middle and one high school. The district has been recognized nationally for its academic and technology programs. In the 2004-2005 school year, Spring Hill students scored above the national average on the Iowa Test of Basic Skills and exceeded State AYP goals for all schools. A proud accomplishment for the district was the recognition of all school buildings achieving one or more "Standards of Excellence" in reading, mathematics, social studies, and science.

Spring Hill School District patrons passed a \$48.6 million bond issue in December 2003. The bond issue provided funding for land purchase and construction of Prairie Creek Elementary School (167th and Mur-Len) and a new high school at 199th and Ridgeview. Prairie Creek Elementary School will open in August 2006 and the new Spring Hill High School will open in August 2007. The current high school will become a middle school. The current middle school will be converted into an elementary school. In addition, \$1 million of district-wide technology improvements will be made.

The high school collaborates with Johnson County Community College to provide College Now and Quick Step college-credit programs.

Spring Hill School District provides a full range of inclusive special education service for students with disabilities and gifted capabilities. Services can start as early as age three and continue to age twenty-one as appropriate.

The district participates in the free and reduced lunch programs. Specific information on enrollment, textbook fees and class schedules can be obtained from Board of Education or the schools. School closings due to snow or other conditions, will be announced on specific radio and television stations. Closing information can also be found on the district's information line (913) 592-7272. CITY BILLINGS

The City reads water meters on or about the 15th of each month. Bills are mailed the last working day of each month. After the 15th of each month, a 10 percent penalty is added. Service is disconnected on the 21st if a payment is not made. A reconnect charge of \$15 is collected to renew services. Any arrangements for extensions must be made prior to the 15th of the month.

SEWER RATES

First two thousand gallons of water consumption \$3.90
Each additional thousand gallons of water consumption \$2
Water customers living outside the City pay a \$20 monthly charge.

WATER RATES

\$5.50 per 1,000 gallons (minimum charge per month \$5.50)
A 10 percent discount is given to senior citizens, 65 or over, which submit a written request to City Hall. All utility bills include a \$5 monthly service charge.

REFUSE COLLECTION

Residential trash collections are made on Thursday. Large items are picked up the first Thursday of each month at no additional charge. Some pickups are delayed one day due to holidays. The City currently contracts with Deffenbaugh Disposal Service for refuse collection. Commercial pickups vary depending on demand. Recycling is offer by Miami County. Paper, plastics, aluminum, cardboard and tin can be sorted and left in a trailer located in the parking lot at 110 East Wilson. The trailer is taken from the site for a few hours each Tuesday and Friday to be emptied.

ANIMAL INFORMATION

Animals are not permitted to run-at-large in the City. A rabies vaccination and city tag are required on dogs and cats more than six months old.

Neutered or spayed dog or cat \$5 Un-neutered or un-spayed dog or cat \$10

The fee is due by Jan. 1 of each year. After March 1, a \$1 penalty per month is assessed. Any dogs caught running-at-large will be impounded. A running and boarding fee will be charged. Animal tags are sold at the Police Department.

BUILDING PERMITS

Building permits are required for all new construction and most alterations and repairs to structures within the City limits and the area designated as Spring Hill's growth area in unincorporated Miami County. Johnson and Miami County have additional regulations for property in the unincorporated areas. For specific information, contact City Hall at (913) 592-3664.

ZONING

Johnson County and Miami County all are zoned areas. Landowners must comply with the property uses allowed within each jurisdiction.

SOLICITING

Door-to-door soliciting is prohibited except by individuals with a permit. Permits may be picked up at City Hall. They must have the City Clerk's approval and signature. The public is urged to check the permit of anyone selling door-to-door. If there is a problem of any kind or if the person failed to produce a valid permit, notify the Spring Hill Police Department.

Renovated from a former elementary school, the Civic Center provides space for community activities and civic events as well as rental space for individual and community use. The Civic Center also houses the Johnson County Nutrition Center providing congregate meals for senior citizens and the Spring Hill Recreation Commission offices and activities. Social service programs of the Multi-Service Center are provided at this location. Spring Hill City Council and City Court meet at the Civic Center. Rental rates vary depending on the space required. A security deposit is required. The facility includes meeting space, a banquet facility, outdoor grounds and a gymnasium. The City of Spring Hill and Multi-Service Center staff oversees maintenance and daily operations of this facility. You may also register to vote at the Civic Center.

SPRING HILL LAKE

Fishing is permitted at Spring Hill Lake, which is located just west of U.S. 169 Highway on Lone Elm Road and Lake Road. Persons fishing at the lake must have a proper permit. No boats are allowed.

HILLSDALE LAKE

Located eight miles south of Spring Hill, Hillsdale Lake provides flood protection along Big Bull Creek. Its facilities also include a campground, horse trails and hunting preserves. There is camping and fishing available at the lake with picnic pavilions for day-trippers. As part of the Osage River Basin, it also contributes to flood protection on the Marais des Cygnes, Osage and Missouri rivers. The lake is located about two miles west of U.S. 169 Highway on 255th Street. It is a water supply source for municipal and industrial needs of surrounding communities. It generates up to 17.3 million gallons of water daily. A park permit is required. For further information, call (913) 783-4507.
